Media Index originally consists of eight main topics, that is, demographic characteristics, printed media reading behaviors, contacts with other forms of media, radio program listener ratings, shopping/dine-out behaviors, life styles, psychological characteristics, and consumer purchasing behaviors. However, Hankook Research publically releases only those items about demographic characteristics, life styles, and living patterns. Hence, this questionnaire is reorganized based on variables and orders of raw data.
