

English Back Translation of the 2024 South Korean CSES Module 6 Survey

Please note that the following survey is **only** an English translation of the actual survey used in the face-to-face interviews conducted for the 2024 South Korean CSES Module 6 Survey. This English survey was **not** used for actual interviews.

While the outlay of this translation and the actual Korean survey used differs, we do not believe this will create any hardships for researchers as questionnaire numbers are kept in-synch across the two documents. Nevertheless, to minimize any possible confusion, we have split questions according to their original page location within the actual questionnaire.

When using the original survey alongside this translation, please note that the Korean letter “문” is used as an abbreviation for the word “문 제”, the Korean word for “question.” As such, “문 1” should be understood as “Q1.”
